Programme Highlight

The Building Energy Code (BEC) 2015 edition was gazetted on 11 December 2015. The energy efficiency requirements as stipulated in the Code had been tightened in tandem with the latest advancement of technology and development of international standards. To facilitate the understanding and compliance of the BEC, a Technical Guidelines for the BEC 2015 was issued in June 2016. This talk will highlight the major changes being introduced in the BEC 2015 and the Technical Guidelines
